City of Phoenix Heat Respite Station

SOLVEIG MUUS, GRACE LUTHERAN OUTREACH TEAM

Over the past 6 years, you have been a good friend, partner, or neighbor of Grace Lutheran Church. You have supported us with donations of food, water, clothing or cash; you have volunteered your time and talents to help with our programs; or you have encouraged us with your ideas, referrals or prayers. We want to **thank you** for your efforts on our behalf in the past – without you, we could not do what we do for the homeless community in downtown Phoenix, and it is because of you that our programs continue to flourish. Are you willing to participate again this year in Grace In the City's Heat Respite program? Please kindly consider our request below.

Because you have been a partner in our ministry in the past, you probably already know this: Grace was *the very first organization in Phoenix* to open its doors to the homeless in July, 2005 when the heat escalated above 110° for days and 21 people (14 homeless) died of exposure *in one week*. With your help, we continue that tradition today as a City of Phoenix Heat Respite Station. **The doors of Hope Hall will be open from June 18 to August 31, from 10:00am – 4:00pm Tuesday –Thursday and 10:00am – 6:00pm Mondays and Fridays.** Last summer we served 5,361 meals, an average of 107 per day (the high count was 179, the low was 61). We serve a meal and snacks, offer clothing and hygiene supplies, show movies, and provide games and activities for our guests. If you can participate in some way again this year, we would be very grateful. Below is a list of ideas for your consideration:

Cash Contribution – We estimate the program will cost \$11,000 this year (air conditioning *alone* in Hope Hall costs \$2500 per month!) We would welcome a check or you can donate online at any time!

Hot Meals – We plan to provide at least two hot meals each week. Your team prepares the meal offsite or at Grace.

Sack Lunches – Your team prepares lunches for 125 people and delivers them to Grace for distribution.

Snacks – Wrapped, prepackaged snacks such as granola bars, cheese or peanut butter crackers, chips or dried fruit and nuts are always welcome.

Water – We consumed 997 cases of water last summer, we anticipate a similar need this summer.

Professional Services – Doctors, dentists, podiatrists, barbers, etc. can donate their time and offer referrals.

Programming – Conducting classes, medical screening, projects, or other ideas would be welcome.

Phone Cards – We are organizing a phone card lottery to give our friends an opportunity to contact relatives.

Volunteer – Under the supervision of our team leaders, your team can help prepare the food, serve, clean up, provide security and/or chat up the guests. There is plenty to do!

Faith's Footsteps



continues each week during the Education Hour. Leaders **DIANE HAVIR, MARGE BALDAUFF AND BRAD SMITH** will greet children ages 3-11 in **Faith Place** for "**SPARK.**" This lectionary-based curriculum is a Sunday school faith-formation program designed to activate faith while it engages kids in activities, games, and puzzles that reinforce each week's Gospel lesson.



Throughout the season of Lent, the children of **FAITH'S FOOTSTEPS** raised money to buy **GOOD GIFTS**. After earning **\$187**, they voted on what to purchase: 33 chicks (\$1 each), 2 ducks (\$20 each), 3 fruit trees seedlings (\$10 each), 2 sets of farming tools and training to use them (\$25 each) and 1 pig (\$30). The remaining money was to go wherever Good Gifts had the need. 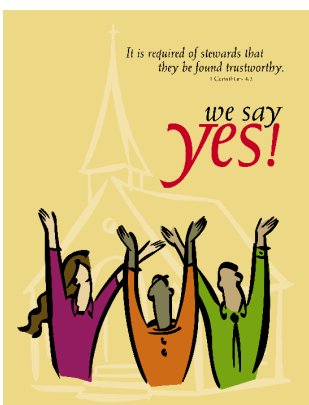

Native American Ministry in the Grand Canyon Synod

PR. JOHN SCHAUMBURG, ASST TO THE BISHOP/DIRECTOR FOR EVANGELICAL MISSION

Recently, the Rio Salado Conference Mission Table discussed the question, "**Does the Grand Canyon Synod have a mission plan for Native American people living either in an urban setting or on reservations connected to urban areas such as Phoenix, Tucson, Las Vegas, etc.?**" My answer was no, we do not have a strategy at this time.

A few weeks later, I attended the All-Staff meeting of CSM (Congregational and Synodical Mission Unit). At that meeting, I met **REV. JESSIE D. HILL**, the new CSM staff person that relates to [Native American ministry](#). I invited him to come to the Grand Canyon Synod to help our congregational and conference Mission Tables begin conversations on ministry with Native American people living near our urban/suburban congregations.

On **May 22, 2012**, Pastor Jessie will meet with rostered leaders and lay leaders of our congregations that may be hearing God's call to initiate ministries with Native American people who live close to them. We will meet at Grace Lutheran Church, Phoenix, AZ, from 10 a.m. to 12 noon. The purpose of this morning meeting is to begin a relationship with Pastor Jessie and hear how CSM is ready to support our ministry with the many Native Americans who are our neighbors. In the afternoon, from 1 p.m. to 3 p.m, Pastor Jessie will meet with leaders who want to discuss specific plans and ideas for their congregation or conference. Some congregations may already be fully involved in this mission and wish to consult with Pastor Jessie on specific issues. Pastor Jessie will also be available in the afternoon on **May 21** and the morning of **May 23**.

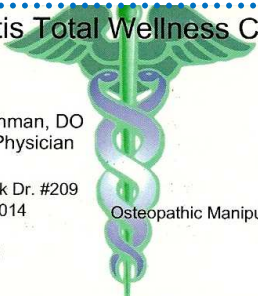

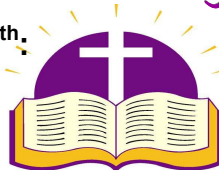

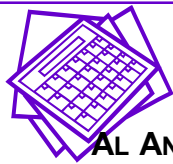
